Working in partnership to tackle crime and anti social behaviour



During the election campaign, a key pledge was to work in partnership to tackle crime and anti social behaviour and this was an issue often raised with us on the doorstep by residents. Recognising that our police force has been facing huge challenges, with demands on policing at an all time high, **Cllr Jenkins** has already begun discussing how best to address these concerns with the local police team. She will be meeting the **Police & Crime Commissioner, Simon Foster** who, in his first year into the job, has already recruited an additional 211 neighbourhood police officers. Moseley Police Station is re-opening now that much needed refurbishment works have been completed and will be a neighbourhood policing hub, housing all four police teams from Kings Heath, Springfield, Sparkbrook and Moseley. We hope this will bring a heightened visibility across Moseley and **Cllr Jenkins** will work with partners, and businesses to find solutions and workable strategies and will be holding regular advice surgeries, street stalls and community meetings to listen to concerns, identify action, working in partnership to make Moseley safer.
