Cost of Living Crisis — Kerry knows from her casework that there are lots of people worried about the rising cost of living. She is working hard to ensure that help is available to all residents needing to access grants and support and making sure all are getting money they're entitled to. If you've lost your job or are struggling to buy for food or pay your rent, there are support services you can get from the council to help. Local welfare provision can make a big difference if you are in a crisis and need food, fuel or basic white goods. Discretionary Housing Payments may also be able to help with rent. To make an application then visit the council website and search for 'Making a claim for short-term help'. If you need urgent support or if you have no internet access then please call **0121 303 1116**.

Need a foodbank referral? Most foodbanks use a voucher referral system (not Kings Heath Foodbank) and vouchers can be swapped for three days of food at your nearest foodbank centre. You can get a referral from your doctor, health visitor, social worker, education provider, the Citizens Advice Bureau or from **Birmingham Council** who can make a referral on your behalf and issue you with a voucher. You can also request a Foodbank voucher online on the council website, search 'Foodbank voucher request' or you can contact the customer service centre on **0121 216 3030**. Because of the crisis many are facing, a high number of requests are being received and the response time is taking longer than normal.

Tackling crime and anti social behaviour

These were amongst key issues discussed at the recent Ward meeting and Moseley's Sergeant Tom O'Keefe, responded to a lot of questions about vehicle crime, anti social behaviour (ASB) and other criminal activity. Questions were also asked regarding problem behaviour at some HMO's and the progress of the Public Space Protection Order (PSPO) for Moseley centre. The meeting were told that an application had been submitted and is currently being checked by BCC's legal team and will soon be out for consultation. **Kerry** urged residents to have a say and make their thoughts known.

Partnership working for a safer Moseley Kerry is delighted to be working with Lynne Baird and the Daniel Baird Foundation and this partnership has seen a bleed control cabinet installed in Moseley. The cabinet contains a bleed kit that can be used by the public before paramedics arrive to control bleeding and save lives. Lynne founded the foundation after the tragic death of her son and is keen to highlight that the bleed kits are not just for use in the event of a violent crime and can be used to treat serious bleed injuries at any type of accident. Kerry is planning to roll out more kits across Moseley in the near future.
